**RESULTS OF ALL INDIA SECONDARY SCHOOL EXAMINATION**  
**2020-2021**

Our School has been registering remarkable achievements year after year in the All-India Secondary School Examination conducted by CBSE. It is indeed gratifying to state that in spite of the sudden shift towards virtual schooling, our diligent students have recorded Hulaudable achievement in Secondary School Examination of Std X in Academic Session 2020-2021 with **100% Result**.

This year total **188** students appeared for the Examination out of which **48 students secured 90% and above marks in aggregate, 76 students got 80% and above marks and in all 151 students secured Distinction**. The **School Topper - Shardul Junagade** made the school proud by scoring **98% in aggregate**. He was closely followed by **Atharva Oke with 97.80% at the Second Position** and **Sayalee Mahagaonkar** who secured **97.20%** took the **Third Position**. Besides this, our students showcased their academic expertise by achieving **100/100 in Maths, Science and Social Science subjects, 99/100 in English and 98/100 in Hindi**.

The phenomenal result achieved by our students during such a turbulent time is greatly praiseworthy. This victory is attributed to the hard work of students, teaching staff and support of proactive parents.

## **INFRASTRUCTURE**

The infrastructure of the school enhances the teaching learning process and creates a favourable environment for the holistic development of a child.

### **LIBRARY**

The school library plays a great role in the life of students by serving as the storehouse of knowledge. The wide range of approximately **17,301** books, Periodicals, Informative Magazines, Newspapers, Maps, CDS, DVDs etc. meet the targets and goals of the students and teachers.

### **MATHS LABORATORY**

Students experiment and explore patterns and ideas with the collection of games, puzzles and other teaching aids in the Maths Lab. It is well equipped with necessary kits, Charts and Tools like Drafter, Vernier Calliper, Plastic Sectors, Instrument Box, Bob for Time Period, Teaching Aid to Find Height of Cone, Geoboard, Trigonometry Aid, Parallelogram Kit, Geometrical Box, Model of Frustum, Working Model Pythagoras, Playing Cards Set, Dice Pack etc.

### **SCIENCE LABORATORY**

Students are encouraged to use the well-equipped Science laboratory to learn through experiments. Every year the latest instruments, specimens, charts etc. are purchased for the lab.

### **COMPUTER LABORATORY**

Computers have always been extremely advantageous to the education system. The lab has 26 LCD Computers and these multifunctional devices are used by the students and staff.

### **AUDIO VISUAL ROOM**

The audio-visual room provides a realistic approach and it enhances deep understanding for the students of Pre-Primary. A large collection of CDs and DVDs enthralls the curious minds.

### **E-BOARDS**

All classrooms have E Boards, which help to improve students' learning, enhance literacy, boost attentiveness, and increase comprehension. It provides an access to tools and materials for audio visual and kinaesthetic learners emphasising on the idea of Universal Design of Learning.

## **SAFETY MEASURES**

Safety and security of the students is ensured with trained security staff. Main gate of the school is constantly guarded by both male & female security personnel. All strategic places are fitted with CCTV cameras, which are continuously monitored. Fire Extinguishers and Fire Alarms are installed at key areas. Firefighting equipments are well maintained. Besides, Fire Fighting Mock Drills as well as Workshops on Electricity & Road Safety are being conducted time to time. The school also has a Disaster Management Team.

### **SOCIAL EMPOWERMENT THROUGH WORK AND ACTION (SEWA)**

The following SEWA ACTIVITIES were conducted

#### **TOPIC ---HAPPINESS AND PRODUCTIVITY DURING COVID TIME**

**STD. 1 HELPING HANDS** Teacher gave a talk in class about the usefulness of everyone's hands. Teacher showed videos where HANDS are symbol of HELP, STRENGTH, WORK, CARE, UNITY, etc. Children took the print of their hand, an outline and wrote words on it's fingers related to values, covid protocol rules and other thoughts. **STD. 2. **STD.4 RECREATION BRINGS HAPPINESS** Teachers shared videos of one or two games that students can play at home with their family members. Students created their own games too. They clicked images of the game they played and shared in the group. They explained the rules of the game for others to learn from them.
